#### ITEM-4: New Regulations (R23)

- Members Ratified the Academic Regulations and course structures of various branches approved by Academic Council.
- Following are the Glimpses of Regulations

❖ R23 Credits :160

For Theory And Practical Courses:

- ❖ Continuous Internal Assessment : 30 Marks
- ❖ Semester End Examination :70 Marks

#### Theory Courses:

- For theory subject, the distribution shall be 30 marks for Internal Evaluation and 70 marks for the End-Examination.
- For practical subject, the distribution shall be 30 marks for Internal Evaluation and 70 marks for the End- Examination.
- If any course contains two different branch, the syllabus shall be written in two parts with 3 units each (Part-A and Part-B) and external examination question paper shall be set with two parts each for 35 marks.
- If any course is having both theory and practical components, they will be evaluated separately as theory and practical. However, they will be given same Course code with an extension of 'T' for theory and 'P' for practical .

#### End Examination Evaluation:

End examination of theory Course shall have the following pattern:

- I. There shall be 6 questions and all questions are compulsory.
- II. Question I shall contain 5 compulsory short answer questions for a total of 10 marks such that each question carries 2 marks.
- III. There shall be 1 short answer questions from each unit.
- IV. In each of the questions from 2 to 6, there shall be either/or type questions of 12 marks each. Student shall answer any one of them.
- V. The questions from 2 to 6 shall be set by covering one unit of the syllabus for each question.

#### **Continuous Internal Evaluation :**

1. For theory subjects, during the semester, there shall be two midterm examinations. Each midterm examination shall be evaluated for 30 marks of which 10 marks for objective paper (20 minutes duration), 15 marks for subjective paper (90 minutes duration) and 5 marks for assignment.
2. Objective paper shall contain for 05 short answer questions with 2 marks each or maximum of 20 bits for 10 marks. Subjective paper shall contain 3 either or type questions (totally six questions from 1 to 6) of which student has to answer one from each either-or type of questions. Each question carries 10 marks. The marks obtained in the subjective paper are condensed to 15 marks.

3. Final mid semester marks shall be arrived at by considering the marks secured by the student in both the mid examinations with 80% weightage given to the better mid exam and 20% to the other.

**For Example:**

Marks obtained in first mid: 25

Marks obtained in second mid: 20

Final mid semester Marks:  $(25 \times 0.8) + (20 \times 0.2) = 24$

If the student is absent for any one midterm examination, the final mid semester marks shall be arrived at by considering 80% weightage to the marks secured by the student in the appeared examination and zero to the other. For Example:

Marks obtained in first mid: Absent

Marks obtained in second mid: 25

Final mid semester Marks:  $(25 \times 0.8) + (0 \times 0.2) = 20$

**Practical Courses :**

- For practical courses, there shall be a continuous evaluation during the semester for 30 sessional marks and end examination shall be for 70 marks.
- Day-to-day work in the laboratory shall be evaluated for 15 marks by the concerned laboratory teacher based on the record/viva and 15 marks for the internal test.
- The end examination shall be evaluated for 70 marks, conducted by the concerned laboratory teacher and a senior expert in the subject from the same department.
- Procedure: 20 marks
- Experimental work & Results: 30 marks
- Viva voce: 20 marks.

In a practical subject consisting of two parts (Eg: Basic Electrical & Electronics Engineering Lab), the end examination shall be conducted for 70 marks as a single laboratory in 3 hours. Mid semester examination shall be evaluated as above for 30 marks in each part and final mid semester marks shall be arrived by considering the average of marks obtained in two parts.

**Eligibility For Award of Degree:**

A student shall be eligible for award of the B.Tech. Degree if he/she fulfills all the following conditions:

- (i) Pursue the programme of study for a stipulated period of four years and not more than eight years.
- (ii) Register for 160 credits and secure the same.
- (iii) Registered and successfully completed all the components prescribed in the programme of study in which he/she is admitted.

- (iv) All mandatory courses must be completed with satisfactory.
- (v) Obtained CGPA greater than or equal to 4.50 (minimum requirements for pass).
- (vi) A student shall be eligible for the award of B.Tech degree with Honors / Minor if he/she earns 15/12 credits in addition to the 160 credits. A student shall be permitted to register either for Honors /Minor and not for both simultaneously.


